Program Overview

Introduction

The Agile method of project management has gained widespread popularity since expanding beyond its origins in software development in the early 2000s. The approach is highly adaptable, and as such it excels as a methodology where project briefs are loose and subject to frequent change, or where there are significant unknowns at the outset. Outside of software development, Agile is often applied to:

- New product development, where the flexibility in planning allows the product to evolve based on real-world feedback
- Marketing and creative projects, where changes in strategy or creative direction arise based on performance metrics or feedback
- Research and Development, where it enables teams to make step-by-step progress and adapt to new information or changes in the project's direction

As well as its adaptability, Agile has other important cultural benefits that arise from the team engagement and collaboration that is bult into its methodology and philosophy.

Our two-day workshop presents the core methodologies and tools of Agile using a project example that teams execute to apply the tools in an actual project environment, empowering them to take Agile directly back to their workplace.

- The origins, principles and core concepts of Agile
- How timeboxing serves to ensure that deliverables are completed on time, with scope being reduced when project risk is realised
- How to prioritise using MoSCoW

- Estimation using the Scrum Poker Methodology
- The various Agile team roles: Product Owner, Scrum Master and Development team
- How to execute an Agile Project using either the Scrum Methodology or the Kanban Methodology
- How to measure progress during an Agile project using Velocity
- How to close an Agile Project

Module 1: Agile Overview & Fundamentals

Overview

The first module introduces the participants to the origins and fundamental concepts of Agile Project Management and underlines the importance of the 12 principles outlined in the Agile Manifesto, which are core to the success of the methodology.

Importantly, the similarities and differences to traditional project management are explained, along with an overview of where and why Agile can be a preferential methodology for project management.

Module 2: Agile Project Planning

Overview

The Agile Project Planning module gets to the core of Agile and how it is used to describe a project and break it down into specific user stories (the equivalent of a Work Breakdown Structure in Traditional Project Management). We look at how each 'story' can be prioritised using MoSCoW, and how the size of each 'story' can be estimated relative to one another using the Scrum Poker method.

The workshop simulation exercise is introduced to the participants at this point, and they will need to create user stories, prioritise them and estimate their relative size, providing valuable practice at the techniques. At this point a Product Owner will be appointed and their role in managing the product backlog described to the team.

Module 3: Agile Project Execution

Overview

The final module shows how teams work together to apply the agile techniques using either the Scrum or Kanban Methods. The role of Scrum Master is introduced, and the simulation exercise continues, now with progress measurements based on the estimated velocity of progress.

As they continue to execute the simulation project, the team will realise the need for changes along the way, and these will be incorporated during their various routine 'ceremonies' that form part of the Agile methodologies.

At the conclusion of the workshop, the team will have astounded itself on what it achieved during the workshop and will have all the techniques and tools to begin applying Agile Methods in their real-world project applications
